

HOW THE GALILEAN PROGRAM WORKS

Since you are now old enough to become a Galilean, you have a wonderful opportunity for growth in your spiritual life. But to grow spiritually there are certain things that are needed — just as there are certain things needed to grow physically.

We all know that if we are to grow physically we must have food, water, exercise, etc. If we are to grow spiritually we must have Bible study (spiritual food), prayer, personal service, and witnessing.

The Galilean program is set up to provide you with the study and service that can bring about spiritual growth.

As you go through the program, you will advance through six areas. After meeting the first set of requirements, you will be a *TYRO*. As you meet other requirements, you will become a *FEL-LOW*, a *FOLLOWER*, a *DISCIPLE*, a *HERALD*, and finally an *AMBASSADOR*. After completing the requirements to become an *AMBASSADOR* you will be eligible to become a *STEWARD*.

In each area of advancement you will be required to do some work in such areas as: the church, Bible study, missions, Christian witness, and personal service.

Background

In 1830 a committee of three was appointed by the New Hampshire Baptist Convention to prepare a systematic statement of Baptist doctrine. The committee completed its work in 1831 and the document was studied and revised by another committee of four. In 1834, as the recommended statement of doctrine was sent out to the churches, Dr. J. Newton Brown, one of the four on the study committee, wrote an appendage to the statements. We call this appendage the Church Covenant.

Church Covenant

Having been led, as we believe, by the Spirit of God, to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior and, on the profession of our faith, having been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we do now, in the presence of God and this assembly, most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another as one body in Christ.

We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit to walk together in Christian love; to strive for the advancement of this church, in knowledge, holiness, and comfort; to promote her prosperity and spirituality; to sustain her worship, ordinances, discipline, and doctrines; to contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the church, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the gospel through all nations.

We also engage to maintain family and secret devotions; to religiously educate our children; to seek the salvation of our kindred and acquaintances; to walk circumspectly in the world; to be just in our dealings, faithful in our engagements, and exemplary in our deportment; to avoid all tattling, backbiting, and excessive anger; to abstain from the sale and use of intoxicating drinks as a beverage; to be zealous in our efforts to advance the kingdom of our Savior.

We further engage to watch over one another in brotherly love; to remember one another in prayer; to aid one another in sickness and distress; to cultivate Christian sympathy in feeling and Christian courtesy in speech; to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconciliation, and mindful of the rules of our Savior to secure it without delay.

We moreover engage that when we remove from this place, we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's Word.
